In 2016, Frederick A. Douglass High School (formally KIPP Renaissance) became the first and only A" rated school in New Orleans Recovery School District. In this same year, we founded our Early College Academy in partnership with Bard College New York.

Frederick A. Douglass is part of a national network of public, open-enrollment, college-prep charter schools committed to preparing students in underserved communities for college and life.

At Frederick A. Douglass, we believe that every student deserves a collegiate-level education grounded in knowledge of history and heritage, rich in character and designed to ensure each student thrives in the four-year college or university of his or her choice.

Our students graduate with a passion to explore the world, a passport in one hand and 60 college credits in the other. They leave with goals for their individual and collective futures, a plan to accomplish those goals, a strong sense of self and love of community. 

RIGOROUS ACADEMICS

All KIPP High Schools in New Orleans offer multiple Advanced Placement pathways and include rigorous core curriculum. This combination, along with frequent teacher feedback and selective teacher hiring has led our schools to be among the top open-enrollment schools in New Orleans.


Frederick Douglass offers multiple pathways for students. In particular, Douglass is home to Bard Early College, where students have the opportunity to graduate from high school with an Associate's Degree in hand. 100% of Bard credits were accepted by Louisiana state universities, meaning that graduates of Bard at Douglass can begin college with 50% of their credits already earned and cutting the time to a degree in half.



COLLEGE & CAREER

KIPP students across the country have access to our KIPP Forward team that focuses on supporting our students two years beyond high school graduation. At Frederick Douglass, we ensure that all college counselors have a 50:1 ratio -five times less than the national recommendation and nine times less than the state average. This means that each student and family gets significantly more personal attention. We support students from the beginning of their post-secondary planning until two years after they graduate from KIPP.

If students are not planning to attend college, we have extensive partnerships within the city to ensure that every student who graduates is prepared for a high-demand, highwage job or apprenticeship.
